# **News From Our Principal**



As we continue our work through the COVID – 19 pandemic, I am encouraged by our accomplishments. Our teachers have been persistent and working diligently to prepare our students for higher levels of academic achievement. This is evidenced by the Class of 2022 earning an unofficial graduation rate of 91%!

This graduation rate surpasses the Buffalo Public Schools average graduation rate and likely the average graduation rate for New York State. Our Class of 2022 accumulated 1.6 million dollars in scholarship monies and students will be attending 23 colleges and universities across the country.

Our PTECH program successfully completed year one of the seven-year grant. The group of 48 students enrolled last Fall will begin experiencing collegelevel work this year, while a new group of 48 students will be enrolled this Fall. We are excited about the collaboration and support provided by Erie Community College and IBM.

We will be welcoming 120 new freshmen to our school during our Freshman Orientation in August. In addition, we will also be hosting a Summer Bridge Academy for our PTECH students after Freshman Orientation, leading up to the beginning of the school year.

We are excited to share that we are in the process of creating a Tiger Technology Lab that gives students access to build, program, and practice operating robots and drones. We are working to gather equipment to make this a state-of-the-art lab, which will build upon our focus on innovative technology.

Our school continues to grow and is becoming a school of destination in the City of Buffalo. We will resume our pursuit of having 700 - 800 students enrolled as we regain classrooms within our school building. This Fall, we will recover classrooms on the fourth floor of the school building. # Focus on Mental Health

hile the pandemic has caused great physical harm and death to millions, its devastating effects have also played havoc with students and staff and their mental health. The Bennett Redesign Team adjusted our focus to make Mental Health our priority.

Principal Carlos Alvarez told us that the students were reaching out because they were in distress. This is a change from before COVID. Your Team researched and learned that BestSelf Buffalo offers a Mental Health First Aid Course that runs weekly for six sessions. Best Self agreed to come to Bennett and teach our students if ten percent of the staff took a pre-requisite mental health training course. The Alumni Association agreed to pay for the teacher training. The staff was willing, and the classes were taught. We plan to expand the program and fund this initiative every semester.

We connected with NAMI WNY (National Alliance on Mental Illness) for the staff. We were able to purchase their Resource Guide, Mind Matters. This book contains a vast amount of contact information for every mental health agency and its specialty throughout our area. We placed the Guide in a gift bag for the teachers for their reference, a letter of support, some candy treats, and a Bennett Alumni mug. We had fun distributing the bags, letting each staff member know how important they are and that their efforts don't go unnoticed.

Your alumni membership and additional contributions made all of this possible. Thank you for guaranteeing our students and staff the necessary tools for maneuvering in these difficult times! We are working our motto, "For the Best is Yet to Be!!"



### From your First Vice President...

s I sit on the porch of the family cottage, typing my comments for the *Summer Beacon*, I'm reminded of that phrase that Jennie Brummer introduced many years ago... **Bennett, the Tie that Binds**. I'm reminded of that not only because I just saw **Judy Eppers Horn, '60** go by on her nightly walk (**Marcia Eppers Little, '65** is back with her for the summer, as well), but I also just typed an obituary from **Judith Bernbeck Kiley, '56** about her sister, **Elizabeth, '58** passing, reminding me that their cousins lived in the cottage next door. In fact, many Bennett people had cottages out here on Lake Erie in Grandview Bay. I recognize many of the Bennett names!

**INSTALLMENT FIVE - THE 1950S** 

### ROCK & ROLL IS HERE TO STAY THE FUN TIMES ACCOMPANIED BY THE SERIOUS

he 1950s marked the beginning of space exploration. This had a huge impact on the educational system. Sputnik, launched by the USSR (Russia), forced the US into a game of catch up. Through the National Defense Education Act, teachers were better trained in the arts, math, and science. Honors classes were introduced to better prepare students and make them more competitive.

It isn't possible to look through a *Beacon* of the 1950s and not see crowds of students attending every club, activity, sporting event, and yes, even studying in the library together. This excitement for learning carried over into excitement for everything happening in the 50s.

The landmark desegregation order of Brown vs. The Board of Education in 1954 started the impetus for redistricting Buffalo schools. Also, many houses were torn down in North Buffalo to make way for the Kensington Expressway. These all changed the demographics of students attending Bennett.

But the changes made for new challenges. As the increase of technology took hold in America and the realization of the Cold War, a new emphasis was placed on being ready.

The Bennett Community Association took part in making changes. They raised money to seed and level the practice field. They sponsored a get-acquainted dance for the freshmen and a Halloween Hop for 1000. They worked to reduce freshman hazing and established a Sunshine Fund for members. Most importantly, the group raised money to help support activities at the school. A Pop Concert at Kleinhans Music Hall netted \$1050.

These post-war years were a time of growth and change in our country and at Bennett.
