The students have collectively embraced the rigor of the academic program, developed and enriched relationships with classmates, teachers and the school, and have seized upon opportunities to strengthen their relationship with family. While awards and citations, which were plentiful this year, are wonderful measurements of a healthy and successful scholastic experience, more appropriate indicators were evidenced through the students' commit-

ment to the Bennett High *community* as well as their regular affirmation of their peers. Bennett High School is truly a remarkable school thanks to the efforts and caring of all its students.

On Friday, June 21, 2013, the 88th Commencement Exercises were held. This graduation ceremony provided the school community and families with the opportunity to celebrate and honor the Class of 2013. Awards and honors were presented to many seniors but most poignant were the comments made by Ryan Montgomery and Chevenne Ketter-Franklin who spoke on behalf of the class. The Class of 2013 leaves behind an impressive legacy of academic achievement, friendship, service and, most impressively, commitment to one another, to their families and to Bennett High School

They have left an indelible imprint on the culture of our school, which will serve as a measuring stick for all future classes. once again this school year. AP Geography, Forensics and Criminal Justice expansion and a Special Education Business Center will be offered for the first time. Additionally, AP Government and AP Literature have been reintroduced for the upcoming school year. The 2013-14 school year will also bring with it the wonderful opportunity for our school community to engage in the Common Core Learning Standards. With the new Common Core Standards, teachers will be working to emphasize greater depth of knowledge. Lessons will be more focused on the most important ideas and students will be asked to think more critically about those ideas. Further, instruction will move beyond memorizing factual information and the application of what has been learned will be emphasized. Among other steps forward, this may mean more project-based learning, hands-on activities; as well as writing that allows students to synthesize information from across subject areas.

Partnerships:

Buffalo Promise Neighborhood continues to partner and support the Bennett High School community and brings a wealth of support for students related to academics, social-emotional, family and community. Some of our service providers are Hillside, Closing the Gap, Buffalo Urban League, United Way, and the Food Pantry.

As the school year comes to a close, I would like to thank the entire school staff who worked so diligently to provide a scholastic experience of rigor and value. I would also like to thank the alumni and the parents and guardians who worked with the school in so many ways to provide a supportive and valued environment.

2013 Outstanding Alumni Award

At Graduation Ceremonies on June 21, 2013, Bennett honored Professor Gary Earl Ross, '69, with its 2013 Outstanding Alumni Award for his contributions in the fields of Education and Writing.

Born in Buffalo, Gary graduated from Woodlawn Junior High School in 1966 and Bennett High School in 1969. While at Bennett he was an active member of the Drama Club and served as Senior Class President. After earning his undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University at Buffalo, Professor Ross taught for 40 years. He retired this year from the UB Educational Opportunity Center.

Gary has authored more than 200 published short stories, articles, op-ed articles, scholarly papers and public radio essays. His works include the books, *The Wheel* of Desire, Shimmerville and Blackbird Rising. Professor Ross's plays have been staged throughout the U.S., Canada, England and China. In 2005, *The Matter of Intent* won the Edgar Allen Poe Award from the Mystery Writers of America. Some of the numerous awards Dr. Ross has received include: The Emanuel Fried Outstanding New Play Award, A LIFT Fiction Fellowship, as well as a Saltonstall Foundation Playwriting Fellowship. He also has received Public Radio Commentary Awards from the New York Associated Press and the New York Broadcasters' Association.

Professor Ross is a member of the Just Buffalo Literary Center, The Dramatics Guild of America, The Mystery Guild of America and Buffalo's Ujima Theatre Company where he is Resident Playwright and an occasional actor.

In his retirement Dr. Ross plans to continue writing. His latest short story, *Good Neighbors*, will appear in the Mystery Anthology, <u>Buffalo Noir</u>, scheduled for release August 6, 2013. He also plans to spend more time traveling with the woman he calls: **My Better Half**, **Really**, Dr. Tamara Alsace. He is the father of five adult children and grandfather of three.

Over \$1,000,000 in Scholarship Monies Earned

by Rachel Stern, College Success Center C tudents in the Class of 2013 Dhave received a significant amount of scholarship money that will help cover tuition and living expenses in college. The majority of students will begin their higher education at community colleges, with many expressing interest in transferring to a four-year school after receiving their Associate's Degree. About 25 students will be attending Medaille College, which in addition to their substantial scholarships and financial aid packages is also a partner with the Say Yes to Education program - ensuring that any remaining tuition payments are covered by Say Yes scholarships. Class valedictorian Chevenne Ketter-Franklin will be attending University at Buffalo, one of the first students from Bennett to attend in several years. A handful of students will be serving in the Armed Forces, either in active duty or with ROTC programs that provide a free college education.

In addition, smaller scholarship awards were handed out at the Class Day ceremony held on May 17th. The senior recipient of the Bennett High School Alumni Award was Ruby Medina-Rivera, honored for her cooperation, leadership, and good citizenship. School-sponsored and local, state, and federal government awards were presented to many deserving seniors.

We are all very proud of the seniors' accomplishments and look forward to hearing about their future successes.

What are Alumni Mini Grants?

E ach September, teachers and staff are encouraged to submit proposals to the principal and the Alumni Association for various projects they would like to carry out during the school year. These proposals are meant to enrich classroom instruction or provide opportunities that students would not normally be afforded during the regular school year.

Each Mini Grant can be up to \$500. The response from the faculty is tremendous, but, unfortunately, we are unable to fund every request. This school year, almost \$6000 was awarded.
