Honor Garden and Memorial Walkway Ceremony

I t was a glorious fall afternoon on Friday, September 23, 2016 as over 50 alumni and their guests and families gathered to celebrate and dedicate our Memorial Walkway, located in front of the building.

Paver bricks and a bench, engraved with names and dates of many special people and events, had memorial candles placed next to them. Trees, replete with memorial plaques, gently swayed in the abundant breeze, reminding us of the people memorialized in their care.

After a brief ceremony hallowing the space and thanking those who donated the initial funds, the engravings on each stone, tree and bench were read. The outdoor ceremony concluded with the singing of the alma mater.

After the ceremony, the guests moved inside to a reception and a time to share special memories. One of those memories was shared by André and Diane Martinelli, who sponsored a paver in memory of their classmate, Donnie Dray. Here's what Diane shared:

"Donnie was a 1965 graduate that I met at a cookout at my friend André's house. André is now my husband! All three of us went to Bennett. André graduated in 1962 and went to the Marine Corps. Donnie and I both belonged to the Drill Team. Donnie was the head of the Drill Team and I marched with a baton. The girls marched behind him at every football game.

"After graduation, Donnie joined the Marines, following in the footsteps of his good friend André. Sadly, shortly after deployment to Viet Nam, Donnie was killed in action, just six days shy of his 20th birthday.

"Donnie was short in stature, but big in heart. He had a great caring personality. We still miss him!

"We decided to keep his memory alive for generations by dedicating a paver in his name at his high school. Semper Fi, Donnie!"

This is just one of the countless stories that are now memorialized in front of our alma mater. There are over 1000 pavers still available to be sponsored with your memories and dedications.

Each year, on the Friday of Alumni Weekend, we will be dedicating and memorializing the new pavers, benches and trees. We will gather on September 22, 2017 to pay homage to our Bennett family!
