Alumni Association Makes Big Decision; Future of Bennett Hangs in the Balance

our Alumni Association made a big decision this fall. Prompted by all the talk of closing Bennett, Irene Greene, President, invited Buffalo School's Superintendent Donald Ogilvie to meet with representatives of the Alumni Association. She asked him to explain the future options for Bennett. He explained that it could become a Charter School and cease to exist as a Buffalo Public School. He also said that the Alumni Association could submit a proposal to radically change the program at the school. The new program had to be so innovative that it would change the culture of the school from failing to achieving. It would, however, remain a Buffalo Public School.

Proposal: Now

The Alumni Board of Directors chose to take on the formidable task of writing a proposal for a new Bennett. A Redesign Team of alumni educators was formed. They were given a broad vision by the Alumni Board. With a deadline of December 12, the group expanded to include teachers, parents, community and students. After many meetings and weeks of work and a well-attended Public

...from the Bennett Alumni Board of Directors Meeting at the school, the proposal was submitted to Buffalo School District administrators for review. The goal is the operation of Bennett under the terms of the proposal by September 2015.

Proposal: Future

With the completion of the proposal, new challenges face the Alumni Association. First, the plan is being evaluated by a panel of judges appointed by the Buffalo School District. Having met the criteria of the judges, the proposal is passed on to the elected members of the Buffalo Board of Education. It needs the approval of the Board to advance to the State Education Department.

Here's where politics become an issue. The majority on the Buffalo Board of Education is known to favor Charter Schools. Members of the Bennett Alumni Association, parents and community members who favor retaining Bennett as a Buffalo Public School will need to exercise their influence to persuade individual members of the Board to vote for the proposal. The vote is scheduled for Wednesday, January 28. Should the effort be successful, the proposal advances to the

A Eulogy for Two Friends

I lost two good friends this past July and both friendships were forged as a result of our membership in the **Bennett Alumni Association**. Both of these men were graduates of BHS; they loved the school and they were staunch supporters of our Alumni Association.

Judge Sam Maislin, '64, died on July 12, 2014. Sam was a member of the Committee that planned the formation of our Alumni Association and in 1997, he served as Chair of the meeting of Alumni who adopted a resolution to form the Association. A full slate of interim officers was elected at that meeting, including me as President and Sam as Vice-President. Sam's counsel was invaluable during our formative years and he served faithfully and with distinction on the Board of Directors as Vice-President for 5 years.

Wayne Reilly, '47, died on July 14, 2014. The year 2000 was the 75th anniversary of the opening of our school and shortly after our Association was officially formed. At the urging of Principal Marilyn Wittman, we began plans for a gala gathering of all Alums to celebrate that mile stone anniversary. Wayne quickly became the leading procurer of advertisements for the "yearbook" commemorating that event and when asked, he gladly accepted chairmanship of that committee, which provided much needed funding for the various programs planned for the anniversary weekend. The event was a huge success and was attended by over 1000 alumni and their guests. Shortly thereafter, Wayne succeeded me as President of the Alumni Association and served in that capacity for three years. Under his leadership the Association continued to grow and flourish. Wayne served on the Alumni Board until the time of his death.

As we mourn the loss of our two friends, we are grateful for having had the opportunity to know and work with them for the betterment of our alma mater. Our deepest condolences go out to Karen Maislin and Helen Reilly and their families in this time of loss. I have made a donation to the Community Foundation /Bennett Alumni Association in memory of Sam and Wayne. If you are so inclined, I encourage you to do the same.

Remembering Joseph Cardina, '39

In addition to remembering Wayne Reilly and Sam Maislin as Founders, we also lost Joe Cardina, who died on Dec. 22, 2014 at the age of 94. Joe was one of the most active members of the Alumni Board, for many years editing the *Alumni Beacon*. We honored him at our Annual Meeting and Brunch a few years ago which was attended by a full table of family members.

Joe had a long career in the newspaper business, first with the *Courier Express*, (1951-1960); then with the *Buffalo News*. He also was active in the Buffalo community, volunteering with many organizations, including the Buffalo Philharmonic. His attention to detail and his great passion for his alma mater endeared him to all who had the pleasure of working with him.



College Success Center Helped by Alumni Association

Dear Bennett Alum - As you know, the Bennett Alumni Association has attempted over several years to help students get to college. Our previous efforts did not work out except in a few instances, but you expressed that you were still interested in helping them.

The situation now is very different and alumni could be of help. Here's what has happened at Bennett...

A UB professor, Dr. Nate Daun-Barnett, has grant money that allowed renovation of an area on the second floor at Bennett which is now known as the College Success Center. It is staffed from 11:00 am-1:00 pm daily. Maureen England, guidance counselor, heads the Center. She has moved her office there and is present on a daily basis. Nate Barnett has provided UB graduate students in Education who also work there; there are generally one or two UB students in the Center each day.

The Center is very busy and additional help would be welcome. The role of the alumni will be to assist students through the well-

defined process that has been developed by Ms England.

Students need someone to talk with about their plans and to assist them as they fill out forms, mostly on-line (rudimentary computer skills will be useful.) The alumni will not in any way be expected to be experts. A packet of information would be available on a first visit to the Center and Ms. England or one of the UB students will provide an orientation.

We will not work with one specific student (unless that works out) but rather we would be available as needed. Work need not be completed in any session; it can be saved for future visits. No specific dates or commitments are required; you could come as available. Six have already signed-on: Ryan Montgomery, Gail Pitterman, Joan Simon, Sue Gardner, Marsha Jadd and Len Katz.

If you would like to assist 4th year Bennett students as they prepare college and financial aid applications, please let me know by calling me at 716-830-6165. Of course, you could visit the Center to determine if this is right for you.

Hope you will find this opportunity to help of interest. Assuming yes, please let us know which day or days of the week would be best (you don't need to be there every week) and, if you will be away for any long periods of time.
