No one could have predicted that COVID -19 would have changed lives the way it has. In February 2021, we were able to welcome a quarter of our students back in the building for traditional school instruction and the remaining students were permitted to return to the building in April 2021.

What an eventful 2021 we have had so far! COVID didn't slow us down; it just changed how we operated. And ZOOM meetings have opened a whole new opportunity for us.



The History of Bennett High School

The moment had come. It was September, 1925. Two thousand two hundred students enrolled. New freshmen came and transfers from Hutch and Lafayette populated the upper grades. A solemn dedication was held on November 24, 1925. At the ceremony, Principal Rhodes introduced the symbols that he had developed and would become the traditional hallmarks that have unified students through the decades.

The population of Central Park was growing more rapidly than even the big school could handle. Five annex classrooms were placed behind the school with a capacity of 40 students each. Clearly, a more permanent solution had to be made. The plan was another new high school, Kensington, and the start of an intense rivalry between the two student bodies. It wasn't

until 1938 that Kensington finally opened.

Kensington joined with Bennett to set an attendance record for a high school football game. In 1948, 52,000 fans came to cheer. The Bennett stands grew quiet as the Tigers were defeated. The score may have been unfavorable, but the attendance record has become part of our shared history.

World War II came to the doorstep of Bennett and every other high school in the 1940s. The fun of growing up was interrupted by the seriousness of glob-

al conflict. Hundreds of students signed up to fight. They served in Europe. They served in the Pacific. They fought the Nazis. They fought the Japanese. Their names are proudly displayed in the front hall. Sadly, 78 died. They are memorialized by a plaque still hanging at the entrance.

On the home front, Bennett's students sold War Bonds, enough to buy a Curtis airplane for the effort. It was an all-consuming endeavor embraced by every student and staff member to raise such a large amount of money. The reward was a Commando airplane with the Bennett Tiger symbol flying and joining the Allies in defeating the enemy.

BPS Gets High Marks for 'Acceleration' Approach

(ed. I was so happy to see this editorial in the Buffalo News on Friday, July 23, 2021. I worked on the 4th floor where the Law Magnet program was housed and got to see how this approach worked. It was a program based on the highest standards and based on developing responsibility and relationships. Many of our young people from the Law Magnet have gone on to distinguish themselves in our community and throughout the country!)

I was pleased to read that the Buffalo Public Schools have finally come to the realization that students benefit more from an "acceleration" approach, rather than repeating a grade. (Buffalo News, July 19). Unfortunately, it took this .long to come to that realization.

Thirty years ago, as coordinator of the Bennett High School Law Magnet Program, I, along with the staff in the program, believed in such an approach. We instituted a program where the students had the same teachers for their four years in high school. The teachers had to agree to teach four levels of the same subject, as to do so would violate the teachers' contract.

These educators were visionaries and agreed to the new idea. The theory behind this new approach was that no student would fail a grade. When they would return in September, they would have the same teacher they had at the end of the last school year. The teacher would know what subject matter

After four years of high school, everyone graduated. Our students had tremendous success and were at the top of the list academically. Not only did this system benefit our students in regard to subject matter, having the same teachers for four years helped forge a bond between student and teacher. These relationships helped provide for a more positive learning environment.

Many outside of our program labeled our system elitist because our students were so successful. We weren't elitists, we just cared about providing each student with the best possible education. Kudos to the Buffalo Board of Education for finally trying something we did 30 years ago.
