As we approach the end of the year, I am encouraged by our accomplishments. As we continue to build our school, we have been persistent with working diligently to improve student



achievement. The following demonstrates some of the successes our incoming Senior Class (our 2016 cohort) have had on New York State Regents assessments:

· ·· English Language Arts-92.9% of our 2016 cohort earned Regents credit and 9.8% scored 85% or higher (the 2020 Senior Class)

··· Global History and Geography -85.9 % of the 2016 cohort earned Regents credit and 19.7% scored 85% or higher (the 2020 Senior Class)

··· US History and Government-70.4% of the 2016 cohort earned Regents credit and 26.7% scored 85% or higher (the 2020 Senior Class)

During this school year, our students had an opportunity to participate in a District laptop distribution program in which they were exposed to the world of work. Students met with staff members within the entire District to troubleshoot problems and distribute laptops. We will resume this program at the beginning of next school year as we continue to offer students real-world work experience.

Our school will offer Advanced Placement courses in which students have an opportunity to earn college credits. We will offer AP Literature, AP US History and Government, AP Biology, AP Computer Science and AP Environmental Science.

Our school has applied for a P-TECH grant and we are awaiting the outcome to determine if we will be awarded the funds to continue our technology-based work. The

> P-TECH grant integrates high school and college coursework, enabling students to begin college courses while in high school. Students also participate in a range of workplace opportunities that

include mentoring, site visits and paid internships, which are designed to support students' academic and professional growth.

We are looking forward to welcoming eight new teachers and over 100 students to our school this Fall, as we continue to build our program. In addition, we will be adding Soccer and Volleyball to the athletic opportunities that our students have access to, as well as multiple technology-based clubs.



Big V. - Bennett Teacher Revered by Students and Staff



I first walked through the doors of Bennett High School in 1993 and I knew instantly, this was my home away from home. I began my career working with Julie Christiano. Julie, my mentor, confidant and friend, graciously allowed me to complete my junior participation hours and senior method hours with her. When it came time to student teach, Julie welcomed me with open arms into her English I classes. After college graduation, I became a substitute and later a teacher aid before I became a full time English teacher.

My first room was 249 (Mr. Feinstein's room before mine!) I remember looking out the window and thinking how lucky I was to work in such a magnificent building; one so rich in history and tradition. I knew that one day I would become part of BHS's traditions. I was at home in 249 for the first 11 years of my career.

In every class that I teach in, every year, I take a minute to soak in the room and surrounding areas. In 1993, it was room 189 (a student teacher on hall duty!), then room 249 and my first homeroom (Two students!); 214 at "Little Bennett"; 255; 365; 155;, 355 and back to 155. Where will September 2019 take me? What room will I be in and what will I learn from that room?

There were many room changes, and they were difficult. But, the hardest change of my career was when Bennett's old programs were closing. It was like watching something you love, die. Honestly, it was heart breaking. I couldn't imagine Bennett not being Bennett! I couldn't see light at the end of the tunnel until the Alumni Association stepped in and saved BHS. I am forever grateful for all the time, efforts and sacrifices so many alumni made..

At the end of the tunnel was Bennett's reopening as Lewis J. Bennett High School of Innovative Technology. I was honored to be invited back: I could not see myself anywhere else but here. And what a great place to be! There are so many new and exciting ad-

ventures to be had: Learning new technology, new teachers and staff. The students are eager to learn and Principal Alvarez and Assistant Principal Barden have created an atmosphere of learning. I feel as if I've had a career face lift!

I don't know how this tradition got started, but somewhere along the way, students started calling me "Big V". To this day, the kids and staff call me "Big V".

It's a name I am proud to have and I am grateful for the opportunity to continue teaching at Bennett. Life is good: Very, very good!
