The entire school community celebrated our students' successes during the first semester by distributing Student of the Month awards. In addition, each student that passed every course during the first marking period was invited to an Academic Achievement Celebration, where we celebrated their successes. I am excited to share that in December we welcomed a group of our highest achieving students into our National Honor Society. We have had our national chapter for 4 years now and over 50 students have been inducted!

n 2002, a group of Bennett Alumni met under the leadership of former Spanish teacher, Jennie Brummer, and established a Bennett High School Sports Hall of Fame. Larry Veronica, former Bennett Physical Education Teacher and Coach, volunteered to chair the committee. We established the criteria for nomination to the new Bennett High School Sports Hall of Fame, which follows:

1.Be a graduate from Bennett High School for at least five years

2.Be a member of at least one Varsity Sports Team and have achieved First Team All-High Honors in that sport. Multisports athletes must achieve at least one First Team All High Honors

3. Another category, "Special Inductees" was established to include a nomination of outstanding coaches and outstanding team or individual achievement. Female athletes prior to Title IX were also considered.

As the year passed, the committee evolved and opened up their scope to be a bit more inclusive. Since the inaugural class of eleven inductees in 2002, 170 Bennett Alumni have been inducted. In addition, we have honored three alumni by naming a memorial award for each upon their passing. Each award has its own unique qualifications memorializing the achievement and high character of these great men - Earle Y. Hannel, Msgr. John Zeitler, and Ricky Mc-Carley.

Every induction ceremony was a lifetime memory for all involved. Ceremonies were held in the Bennett Auditorium, which is a lasting memory in and of itself. At the induction ceremony, each inductee, after an on-screen recap of their Bennett career, would present their memories. These inductees' memories were so heartfelt, emotional and moving for everyone in attendance as well as for the inductees. It was evident that Bennett played such a big role in the individual growth and development through the inductees' formative years.

The induction also included a front hall reception with food and beverages accompanied by displays of the individual inductees, which allowed those in attendance to socialize.

To focus on the inductees relative to their memories and accomplishments, a Bennett High School Sports Hall of Fame website has been developed. One may read about an inductee by going to the website <u>www.bennettsportshalloffame.org</u>. Then, type in the inductee's name and year they graduated and click on their photo to read about them. This Hall of Fame committee met each month of the year to discuss and select inductees.

Football Places Second in Class AA State Game

hat an unbelievable season for our Football Team! We swept the region and advanced all the way to the State Class AA finals game in Syracuse.

Under the leadership of Coach Steve McDuffie, who was selected as the *Buffalo News* Coach of the Year, the team (11 - 2) suffered only one loss in regular season play to Orchard Park with a score of 36 -51. That defeat would be avenged in the first playoff game when the Tigers crunched Orchard Park 70 -20 propelling our boys to an eventual State championship game.

Scores throughout the season were decisive, with three shutouts and double-digit wins against some notably seasoned teams such as Williamsville North, Clarence and Lancaster.

Following the Orchard Park massacre, the team faced Lancaster for their closest victory in playoffs with a score of 14 - 10. Bennett readily trounced Mc-Quaid Jesuit (26 - 14) and Cicero-North Syracuse (38 - 0) setting them against Carmel (9 - 2) at the Championship game in the Carrier Dome in Syracuse.

Great play and hard effort would not be rewarded at the Dome. Our boys suffered their second defeat this season with a score of 12 - 42.

Coach McDuffie was assisted by Khalil Cottman, Arthur Jordan, Anthony Scott, William Blackford ('88), Marty Trisdale, Bob O'Connor, Djuan Todd, Jermane Clemmons and Aaron Young ('96).

Coach McDuffie commented, "We've had over 20 colleges in to see the kids. We have been successful in graduating 98% of our student-athletes with over 80% of them going on to play football elsewhere."

es, World War II was the focus of the start of the decade. With the war's end, the reputation of Bennett grew to national prominence. The scholarship of the faculty and the students was recognized. Evidence included a high level of learning that propelled graduates to prestigious colleges and universities throughout the country.
