# **Principal's Update**

As we approach the end of the first semester, it is amazing how fast this school year is passing. As we continue to speak to many teachers and students, we often discuss how to build upon our culture of datadriven decision making, celebrating successes and technological innovation.

We have worked tirelessly with our senior class, and the fruits of our labor are beginning to show. We are truly excited about the current and future successes of our senior class. Students in our senior class are beginning to receive their college acceptance letters at a feverish pace. Students are sharing their acceptance letters on a daily basis, which are, in turn, posted in the Do Tran

hallways, as we acknowledge their achievements. Along with their college acceptance letters, we have posted a "Scholarship Goal Thermometer" that is set at a goal of \$750,000 scholarship dollars. As of January 2020, our senior class has already surpassed our goal by earning \$913,000. There is no doubt

that we will surpass \$1,000,000, as we are still in the early stages of college acceptances.

The Bennett community celebrated our student progress during the first semester by hosting our quarterly Academic Achievement Celebration Ceremony. Each student that earned Merit Roll, Honor Roll, and High Honor Roll academic successes were invited, along with their family, to the celebration. Each student received a certificate and a letter with the school seal, highlighting their wonderful efforts. So much improvement meant that we ran out of High Honor Roll certificates due to the number of students being recognized for earning this best of the best category!

We were excited by a press conference that was held at our school in December, which focused on our student-led E-Sports program. The press conference was attended by most of the local media outlets and we were featured on local news channels as well as the <u>Buffalo News</u>. Our students received a \$4,000 donation from AT&T that will go directly to the students participating in the E-Sports program.

Bennett continues to build upon our athletic programming, and our students are excelling in the classroom, as well as on the playing fields. We have three student athletes who have been offered scholarships to play college - level football, and we are expecting that number to increase. In addition, we are currently fundraising to purchase a rebounding machine for our basketball programs, at a cost of approximately \$6,500. We have built a partnership with Alternative Information Systems (AIS), who has donated \$1,000 towards the rebounding machine. We are hopeful that we will raise the necessary funds by next Fall, so that our student athletes will have an opportunity to improve their shooting skills as we compete to become New York State Champions! ## Alumni Redesign Team at Work

### The Bennett Redesign Team is

continuing its work in the second semester of the 2019-2020 school year. Our goal, as always, is to advance the academic program at Lewis J. Bennett. The work of the Redesign Team reflects the Alumni Association's mission to actively support the work of administrators, faculty and staff, including academics and support services. For this semester, the Team has the following projects:

#### •••Space:

The Bennett campus has three separate schools currently occupying space in our building. As our enrollment increases, it is necessary for at least one of the programs to move. The District has scheduled Middle Early College High School, one of the schools in our building, to move closer to ECC Downtown. We are following the progress on this move, which is not yet confirmed. Housing so many students is no longer sustainable. We have to be sure that this project crosses the finish line.

#### **•••**Restorative Practices:

We would like Bennett to be the Restorative Practices high school model for the Buffalo District. Restorative practices are a system that allows students who make mistakes to fix them and to establish positive relationships with those affected. A restorative practices facilitator would train the staff and would identify students in need of extra support. The Redesign Team has drafted a proposal that will be submitted to the District for inclusion in next year's budget.

The educators on the Redesign Team are happy to lend their years of experience to helping Bennett students now.
