## **News From Our Principal**



s we approach the end of the first semester, it is amazing how fast this school year is passing. Data driven instructional decision making, as well as providing students with timely, relevant, and impactful feedback continues to be at the forefront of our instructional model. Our tremendous teaching staff continues to incorporate strategies that identify learning gaps and develop plans of ac-

tions, with a laser-like focus, to address their students' needs.

We have worked tirelessly with this year's graduating class, and the fruits of our labor are beginning to show. We are truly excited about the current and future successes of our senior class. Students in grade 12 are beginning to receive their college acceptance letters at a feverish pace - sharing their acceptance letters on a daily basis, which are in turn posted in the hallway, as we acknowledge their academic successes. Along with their college acceptance letters, we have posted a "Scholarship Goal Thermometer" that demonstrates a goal of 1.5 million scholarship dollars. As of January 2023, our seniors have earned \$978,000. We truly believe that we will surpass that goal, as we are still in the early stages of college acceptances.

The Lewis J Bennett school community celebrated our student successes during the first semester by hosting our quarterly Academic Achievement Celebration. Each student that earned Merit Roll, Honor Roll, and High Honor Roll academic successes was invited to the Academic Achievement Celebration.

Our Bennett football team had an unbelievable season. Our Tigers won the New York State Class AA high school football championship! Our Bennett Tigers are the first Buffalo Public School to win a Class AA football championship.

Along the way to our championship, our Bennett Tigers overcame every obstacle put in front of them. The largest obstacle was when Section VI deemed one student ineligible due to a clerical error. This led to our Bennett Tigers having to forfeit the first six games of the season and jeopardized the team making the playoffs. The team rallied to win their final two regular season games to make the playoffs and brought home the championship!

We held a championship parade, from Bennett High School to City Hall, for the team on December 22, 2022. The team was honored by having December 4th, 2022 titled "Bennett High School Football Day". Our Tigers finished the year ranked #1 in New York State Class AA and #5 in all of New York State high school football!

On behalf of our faculty, staff, and students, I would like to thank the Bennett Alumni Association for their continued support!

#### One Down and One to Go ...

Bennett is thriving. The 2022 graduation rate was 92 percent. There are hundreds of applicants for limited space. Until September, three schools were housed on our campus. We were successful in having one school moved to a new location. It is our goal this year to keep insisting that the second school be relocated. We have enjoyed the support of Superintendent Tonja Williams in this effort. She provides funds and removes obstacles. The process, however,

is very complicated. We are committed to monitoring, tracking, and following District actions until Bennett is a single-school campus once again. This will enable us to expand our enrollment to about 750 - up 350 from our current capacity.

#### Mental Health First Aid...

Our children are living in a world filled with threats. The pandemic created conditions that are unprecedented for students. Further, every day they are reminded of their personal safety as they are greeted by security, and they are wanded as they come through the school's doors. Many are seeking help in coping.

The Redesign Team offered help that was funded by the donations that you make to your Alumni Association. Partnering with local agencies, Compeer and BestSelf, students have been offered a Mental Health First Aid course. The staff has also been trained. We are working with the Support Staff to design and communicate a way for anyone hearing or seeing anything that triggers a warning to report it to a trusted adult. All of this effort is to help our young people feel safe and secure. We will work tirelessly to that end.

#### **Coach Steve McDuffie**

ongratulations to Bennett football coach Steve McDuffie who has been nominated by the Buffalo Bills for the 2022 Don Shula NFL High School Coach of the Year Award. His nomination comes after he led the Tigers to a New York State Public High School Athletic Association Class AA Championship. In doing so, Steve has become the first Black coach to win a NYSPHSAA football title.

**INSTALLMENT FIVE - THE 1950S** 

Rock & Roll is Here to Stay - The Fun Times Accompanied by the Serious

he 1950s marked the beginning of space exploration. This had a huge impact on the educational system. Sputnik, launched by the USSR (Russia) forced the US into a game of catch up. Through the National Defense Education Act, teachers were better trained in the arts, math and science. Honors classes were introduced to better prepare students and make them more competitive.

It isn't possible to look through a *Beacon* of the 1950s and not see crowds of students attending every club, activity, sporting event, and, yes, even studying in the library together. This excitement for learning carried over into excitement for everything happening in the 50s.

The landmark desegregation order of Brown vs The Board of Education in 1954 started the impetus for redistricting Buffalo schools. Also, many houses were torn down in Buffalo to make way for the Kensington Expressway. These all changed the demographics of students attending Bennett.

But the change made for new challenges. As the increase of technology took hold on America and the realization of the Cold War, a new emphasis was placed on being ready.

The Bennett Community Association took part in making changes. They raised money to seed and level the practice field. They sponsored a get-acquainted dance for the freshmen and a Halloween Hop for 1000. They worked to reduce freshman hazing and established a Sunshine Fund for members. Most importantly, the group raised money to help support activities at the school. A Pop Concert at Kleinhans Music Hall netted \$1050.

The 1950s were a magical time full of all kinds of experiences and activities. There were challenging classes with honor societies in every subject. We reached out into the community through our Hi-Y clubs, Red Cross and Civil Defense Club. There was a club for everyone: chess, drama, languages, professions, sports, monitors, skating, fencing, photography, stamp, coin and more.

Probably the greatest memories of all were the assemblies. There was so much talent and so many wonderful performances of plays and variety shows.

It was a time of rock and roll. Dances were held at the Statler Hilton, Trap and Field Club and the Grover Cleveland Country Club. There were movies at the Granada, North Park, Amherst, Central Park and, yes, the Drive-In.

In 1950, Bennett had 91 staff members. Fiftyeight of these were teachers with more than 25 years' experience in the Buffalo Schools.

## **Bennett Tigers are Class AA State Champions**

It's not even past." For the 2022 Bennett Football Tigers, this line would ring profoundly true in a couple of ways. First, the Tigers spent the offseason preparing for a successful campaign that would return them to the state finals and allow them to scale the last summit which had eluded them in 2021. For the coaches and players, this meant studying the Carmel game film,



hitting the weights and cardio, and attending multiple football skill camps. Preparations like these are the usual ingredients for Bennett football success, but in this offseason,

the focus and refortifying were particularly in earnest. The unraveling at the Carrier Dome weighed prominently.

Secondly, the Bennett football program faced, after earning one of its most important wins of the season against Lancaster in week six, an unfathomable challenge from a Section VI ruling. The Section notified Bennett that its four victories up to that point would now be forfeits due to a clerical error in filing transfer paperwork for one of the Bennett players. The new challenge seemed to resemble past adversities faced by Bennett and the Buffalo Public Schools in dealings with Section VI. Now, Bennett would have to win its final two games against Niagara Falls and

Hutch Tech just to qualify for the playoffs, and from there, the team would have to play on the road the duration of the postseason.

But the 2022 football Tigers possessed a destiny and determination like no others. Week seven was senior week and the team held a meeting with Coach McDuffie. The coach advised, in one of the toughest talks he's ever had to deliver, that the team's wins to that point would be forfeits, and that the next two games would determine Bennett's playoff fate. The team leaders stepped up and confidently and resiliently declared that they could win the next seven games straight on the road to bring the football program to its highest height -- a Class AA New York State title. And this is exactly what the Bennett Tigers did! They defied daunting adversity and historical challenges to emerge triumphant as Lewis J. Bennett's first state championship team. And they did it with resounding and emphatic play, defeating Section IX's Newburgh Free Academy, 42 - 8, in the Carrier Dome on December 4th.

The Tigers were led this year by their senior captains, QB Antonio Davis III, lineman Rashard Perry, center and linebacker Xzavier Goodman, lineman Jason Gwan, and wide receiver and linebacker Jayden Lewis. Rashard Perry and Jayden Lewis were All New York State in 2021 and all five captains returned as All Western New York. These five were joined during the offseason by six transfer student-athletes who would figure big for the Tigers in 2022: Aaron Roseboro from St. Francis, Cureem Hathcock and Darrell Hamilton from Canisius, Demario Clemons from Sweet Home, Kahmari Cook from North Carolina, and Ja'Meer Thomas from Maritime
