A swe approach the end of the first semester, it is amazing how fast this school year is passing.

Data driven instructional decision making, as well as providing students with timely, relevant, and impactful feedback continues to

be at the forefront of our instructional model. Our tremendous teaching staff continues to incorporate strategies that identify learning gaps and develop plans of action, with a laser-like focus, to address their students' needs.

The Lewis J Bennett school community continues to celebrate our student successes. We have hosted three Academic Achievement Celebrations during the first semester of classes. Each student that earned Merit Roll, Honor Roll, and High Honor Roll academic successes was invited to the Academic Achievement Celebration.

Our extended learning opportunities for students started in October 2023. Students receive academic support as well as enrichment experiences after school. The PTECH after school sessions also allow students to have mentoring opportunities and projectbased learning experiences focused on working with drones and robotics.

Our Juniors and Seniors enrolled in our Software Development and Networking majors are able to participate in our newly designed Student Technology Leadership Program (STLP). It is our hope that student technology leaders will also be able to assist new students, or those who are unfamiliar with BPS platforms, to access and utilize Schoology, One Drive, Infinite Campus and more.

The Lewis J Bennett school community will be welcoming another select group of high achieving students into our National Honor Society. We have had our national chapter for seven years now and nearly 100 students have been inducted.

Our Lewis J Bennett football team had another unbelievable season. Our Tigers advanced to the New York State Class AA high school football semi-final game for the third consecutive year, which is the first time this has ever occurred for a Buffalo Public School. Along the way, we won the Section 6 Class AA championship, and the New York State Regional championship. Our Tigers finished the year ranked #1 in Western New York, #2 in New York State Class AA and #11 in all of New York State high school football. We had seven student athletes named to the first team All-Western New York team and three named to the first team All- New York State first team. In addition, four student athletes have been offered scholarships from Division 1 college football programs.

On behalf of our faculty, staff, and students, I would like to thank the Bennett Alumni Association for their continued support!
